*My Dear Friends,*



- Each guest has been assigned a bid number for the evening (on the back of your booklet).
- Please use your assigned bid number when making bids on the Oral and Silent Auction.
- Payment must be made in full on April 7, 2018 by cash, personal check or credit card. Credit card purchases must be a minimum of \$25. Make checks payable to St. Mary's Church.
- Payment for all auction items may be made at one time. The bank will open at 9:00 and the cashier will be available until the end of the evening.
- When payment has been made at the cashier's table, bidders should take the receipt to one of the auction committee members to claim their items at the table where they are displayed or to the stage area. **PLEASE DO NOT PICK UP ITEMS BEFORE MAKING PAYMENT!!** All gift certificates, ball game tickets and certificates for service can be claimed at the cashier's table.
- Please do not take the tag with the number of the item home with you. We will use these again next year.
- All certificates and services must be used within **ONE YEAR**, unless otherwise specified by the donor.
- **ALL SALES ARE FINAL!!** There will be no refunds or exchanges
- Please understand there may have been changes (additions, deletions, etc.) made after this book was printed. These will be announced. If you have any question please contact one of the Auction Committee members for assistance.

### NOTE ON CREDIT CARD USAGE

We are happy to have you use your credit card as a convenient way to pay for your auction merchandise. However, be aware that there will be a **3% surcharge** on your final bill (ex., an additional \$3.00 would be added to a bill of \$100). This will defray the cost of accepting a credit card.

- Bidding in the oral auction is by raising your assigned bid number, which is found on the back of your program book, to get recognition from the auctioneer and assistants.
- The successful bid number will be announced by the auctioneer.
- The item and amount bid will appear on the computer printout for each bid at the end of the evening.

## SILENT AUCTION GUIDELINES

**Silent Auction Section I closes at 8:00 p.m.  
Silent Auction Section II closes at 8:15 p.m.**

**MINIMUM STARTING BID  
ON ALL SILENT AUCTION ITEMS  
IS \$5.00**

There are two ways to participate in the Silent Auction.

- Bids can be written on bid sheets associated with the item you are interested in. Include your bidder number and amount of bid. **Each new bid must increase the previous bid by \$1.00; otherwise the bid is void.**

**OR**

- Anytime during the evening you can put your ULTIMATE BID in the BID BOX. Then ten minutes before the closing of each Silent Auction section you will be notified of the impending closing and that you have your last chance to place your top bid in the ULTIMATE BID BOX.

To make your ULTIMATE BID write your name, table #, bidder # and # of the item you want to bid on and the highest bid you are willing to give. ULTIMATE BID slips can be found on your table or on the display table near the BID BOX.

This will allow those bidders who do not want to be taken away from the Oral Auction or those who do not want to battle the crowd at the time of closing of a section to bid on a silent auction item by putting their final/top bid into the ULTIMATE BID BOX.

Only bids placed in the ULTIMATE BID BOX before the specific section closes will be accepted. To prevent ties do not make your final bid in an even-dollar amount. After the section closes the bid sheets will be collected and the ULTIMATE BID BOX slips will be tallied.

NOTE: The bidder with the highest bid – either the last posted bid on the bid sheet or the highest bid placed in the ULTIMATE BID BOX will decide the winner of that item.

- In the case of a tie bid those bidders will be asked to rebid and break the tie.
- Item may be claimed after the bank opens at 9:00 p.m.
- The cashier will have the item and bid amount on the computer printout at the end of the evening.
